SUPPLIES:

Gingerbread cookie dough, chilled Baking sheet Parchment paper Gingerbread cookie cutter Candy sprinkles for eyes and mouths Garlic press and/or a Play-doh Fun Factory Rolling pin Flour for rolling Toothpick Knife Oven Photos or drawings of Alutiiq Clothing

Optional – small shape cookie cutters, royal icing

Step One: Mix

Make your dough and chill it overnight. We recommend Martha Stewart's gingerbread recipe: <u>https://www.marthastewart.com/856801/basic-gingerbread-cookies</u>

Step Two: Cut

Roll out a portion of your dough and cut out enough gingerbread people to fill one sheet without crowding (6 per sheet). Cut the cookies at least 1/8 inch thick. Place the cut cookies on parchment paper on a cookie sheet. While you are working, keep the rest of your dough in the refrigerator.

Step Three: Decorate

Use candy sprinkles to add eyes and a mouth.

Press some dough through the garlic press/fun factory to form strands and give your cookie a hairdo.

Press some dough through the garlic press/fun factory, or cut length of dough to form strands for making clothing. Use the drawing of Alutiiq clothing provided below for inspiration.


Step Four: Bake

Bake your cookies following recipe directions. Be careful not to overbake. The cookies will harden a little as they cool, so take them out before they start to brown.

Step Five: Ice

When the cookies are completely cooled, you can add royal icing to accent clothing details or color areas. Consider using red, white, and black—traditional Alutiiq colors.



Made from bear intestine



Made from caribou skin Decorated with puffin beaks




